Students should plan to take this course in their last spring semester before graduation and upon completion of the required study abroad credits. Please consult with advisor on scheduling for the required FREN 4500 course. Note that a student with a valid scheduling conflict may substitute FREN 4699 (Undergraduate Research) for FREN 4500 (Intercultural Seminar) with approval from the Director of Undergraduate Studies and/or Assistant Director of Undergraduate Studies. Valid scheduling conflicts include co-oping, interning, or studying abroad in the spring semester of one's senior year or needing to take another required major course in the same time slot in one's senior year.

³ Students are required to complete at least 39 credit hours of upper division coursework overall.

- ⁴ FREN 34XX classes or FREN special topics courses taught in English may not be used here. They may be used in field of study or free electives.
- ⁵ A minimum of 6 credits from the 3000 or 4000 level French ALIS Major Requirements must be completed abroad in French. A student may petition to have the 6-credit study abroad requirement reduced or waived under circumstances of extreme hardship or in the event of program cancellation. If approved, the student would substitute the overseas experience with a comparable cross-cultural experience as approved by the Program Director, Director of Undergraduate Studies, and/or Assistant Director of Undergraduate Studies.
- Students are strongly encouraged to take additional language courses, linguistics courses, and relevant area studies courses as part of their free elective credits.
